## **Property Assessments**

Annual property assessments were mailed out mid-January and offer property owners a unique opportunity to look at the changes in value over the past year and compare it with other property values in the community.

Our ward Métis councillor, Ashley Salvador, offered via Twitter some words of insight to recipients of assessments:

"If you wish to make a formal complaint [about the assessed value of your home] you must file it before March 23 ... [Tax] Notices will then be mailed in May 2023...These notices are important because they help the City determine the fair share of taxes that each property owner should pay. They do not look at any other inputs (like income) aside from value or wealth stored in property."

The City has a variety of resources that can help you with your assessment. You can access these through http://myproperty.edmonton.ca, or by calling the city's assessment team through 311.

## Valley Line LRT Saga: Repaired, But Not Quite Ready

TransEd shared in late January that repairs to 94% pillars on the Valley LRT line have been completed and testing has resumed on some parts of the line. Minor steel reinforcements are still being completed in the coming weeks, with over 50% of those already done as of January 20th.

The cracks were discovered late last year where the 'Y'-shaped pier arms meet the main column. The

cracks were the result of inadequate rebar to withstand the forces of trains moving on curved areas of the track. In solution, TransEd inserted more rebar where the arms meet the main column, poured additional concrete in the "V" of the piers, and added exterior steel braces to "belt" the columns (as seen on the piers by 98 Ave). With these braces now required for structural support, the final look of the piers is still in discussion between TransEd and the City.

Currently, the LRT project is two years behind schedule. TransEd has yet



to announce when the line will open to the public. Following the completion of all the repairs, testing will continue, and we can expect to see the new trains down by the Muttart. The City stresses that we should expect trains in testing on the tracks; in late January outside Bonnie Doon Mall, a vehicle turned right on a red light and collided with a train. The driver was not seriously hurt, but it is an important reminder that many of the Valley Line LRT intersections do not use crossing gates and bells like we may

be used to in other parts of the city.
